9:30AM The Parade begins promptly at 9:30. The Parade line will start out from Glendale School and process along the route as follows: South on Congress to Fountain; Fountain to Woodbine; Woodbine to Elk; Elk to Greenville; Greenville to Willow; Willow to Sharon; Sharon to the War Memorial.
